

KIRBY'S MILL RESTORATION UPDATE

Thanks to our wonderful donors, the new waterwheel at Kirby's Mill is becoming a landmark. But wait...there's more!

The mill donors of 2022 will soon see their contributions used to stabilize the mill house with these next steps: the slight splaying of the walls will be corrected with tie rods, the balcony overlooking the lake will be repaired/strengthened, and rainwater runoff between the dam and the mill will be redirected. The supports and sagging water box (that supplies the flume with water) will be rebuilt, along with the water conduit that brings water from the lake to the top of the waterwheel. The Friends group is awaiting word from several local contractors who were sent proposals for doing the work.

After that, we will be working on "The Passageway": access to and around the mill. Plans include a path to the mill from the road, replacement of the exterior wooden staircase and the decking next to the waterwheel, and repair of the swinging bridge.
