From our Park Director

This month is a very important month for us as we have Issue 16 on the ballot. Issue 16 is the operating budget that allows us to carry on our day-to-day operations such as maintaining trails, basic contracted services, and supplies and materials to maintain the park, and about a third goes towards our three part-time staff salaries.



Issue 16 is very important to the park. Currently, property owners are paying \$14.77 per year per \$100,000 valuation of your home. The additional funding in the replacement levy is \$3.23 per year per \$100,000 valuation of your home. That is less than a penny day increase! We think the beauty of this park and the endless benefits are worth it.
